Season of Advent

We have already entered into the season of Advent, the liturgical time which prepares us for Christmas, inviting us to lift our gaze and open our hearts to welcome Jesus. During Advent we do not just live in anticipation of Christmas; we are also called to rekindle the anticipation of the glorious return of Christ — when he will return at the end of time — preparing ourselves, with consistent and courageous choices, for the final encounter with him.

During these four weeks of Advent we are called to leave behind a resigned and routine way of life and to go forth, nourishing hope, and nourishing dreams for a new future. First of all, Advent invites us to a commitment to vigilance, looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of people, of brothers and sisters, and to the desire for a new world. Advent is a favorable time to open our hearts, to ask ourselves concrete questions about how and for whom we spend our lives. The second attitude during this time of waiting for the Lord is that of prayer. Vigilance and prayer are two words for Advent: Because historically the Lord came in Bethlehem; and He will come, at the end of the world and also at the end of our individual lives. But every day, every moment, He comes into our hearts, with the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. (Homily of Pope Francis)

Advent invites us also to surrender ourselves afresh to God's future. It calls for the humility that willingly confesses that a sense of God's presence is all too easily lost in busy and distracted lives. What we cannot imagine in ourselves the Lord gladly offers in his continuing presence. May this promise renew our strength during the days ahead. In the words of St Paul, "the time has come; our salvation is even nearer than it was when you were converted, it will be daylight soon. Let us give up all the things we prefer to do under cover of the dark. Let us arm ourselves and appear in the light." I wish each one of you a very fruitful and blessed advent season.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

On 8 December the Church celebrated the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception teaches that, by a singular grace of God, the Virgin Mary was conceived without original sin: i.e., from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.

In our life as Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, the Immaculate Virgin Mary occupies a very unique place. She is presented to us as model for imitation, and we are invited to contemplate in her the fullness of self-giving to God and neighbor (C.44). We have to strive

to make her dispositions of faith, hope and charity and her perfect union with Christ, our own (C. 4). We are to welcome the Word as Mary did and ponder it in our heart in the silence of our whole being like Mary, the listening virgin (C.39). In order to strengthen the gift of chastity we are asked to entrust ourselves lovingly to Mary the Virgin Mother (C.17). We are also called to cultivate a grateful, trusting love for Mary and commit ourselves to pass this love on to young people (C. 44). Pope Paul VI says: "The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is an intrinsic element of Christian worship (MC,56).

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a major feast for all of us, and so it should always be celebrated in a fitting manner in all our houses with due spiritual preparation. We are reminded of it in our Regulations: "Let the Marian devotion proper to our Institute be lived according to the liturgical cycle. The solemnities of the Immaculate Conception and Mary Help of Christians will be prepared for by a novena" (R.30). During this first three-year period in preparation for the centenary of the FMA presence in India and the 150th of the foundation of our Institute, together with the FMA world let us "Give Thanks" for the innumerable graces we constantly receive through the intercession of our Blessed Mother, allowing gratitude to emerge for the gift of holiness in the Institute and for the relevance of the Salesian mission in the world.

Triennial preparation for the centenary Celebration

We are already aware of the celebration of Centenary of the presence of the FMA, and - in India. The whole FMA India launched into a three year preparation for the arrival of our 6 missionaries Sr. Teresa Balestra, Sr.Luigina Appiano, Sr. Catherine Marnetto, Sr. Consiglia Tarricone, Sr. Teresa Merlo and Sr. Maria Angeleri in the Indian soil which will be celebrated in 2022. We thank God for these valiant and courageous Sisters who sowed the seed of the Salesian Charism in our land. As we launch into this preparation of these 100 years of bountiful grace, we raise our gratitude to God for the humble beginnings which has now grown into a mighty tree of 7 Provinces. Let us unite in prayers and authentic preparations in this Triduum with the theme and yearly proposals of the FMA PCI.

THEME: "With Mary through the Course of the Century (1922-2022) and beyond ...

- 2019-2020: Give thanks: "Let us truly thank the Lord who gives us many graces" (L 37, 10) Living our FMA Identity with Gratitude: To re-live and transmit the Spirituality of the Preventive System to the younger generations.
- 2020-2021: Accept the mandate: "I entrust them to you." Reviving the Family Spirit and strengthening Community Communion, building authentic relationships.
- 2021-2022: Plan the future boldly: "Courage! Let us go ahead with a great and generous heart" (L 47, 12) Prophets and witnesses for a transformed society in the style of Synodality, involving the young people and the laity in our mission and apostolate.

Let us raise our hearts to thank the Good Lord for the marvels wrought in our land and we salute our pioneers for their unwavering faith to keep alive the charism of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello in our land and its people. May this journey we have launched together truly be a spiritual renewal of every FMA in our Province and an opportune moment to
