My dear Sisters,

Affectionate and prayerful greetings from the provincial house, Dum Dum!

Following the invitation of our dear Mother General, I am sure all the communities have taken up seriously the personal and community study and reflection on the theme of the General Chapter XXIV in view of giving your valid suggestions to the three questions. Let us be attentive to interiorize our reflections and sharing and make them part of our life so that by entering into the depth of the content that the theme offers us, we may discover and live our being together as educating communities with greater generative awareness. In preparing for the provincial Chapter, let us involve the young people and the laity and other groups of the Salesian Family. Let us also make sure that young people can express themselves and tell us what they feel and think.

Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle

Month of July brings the Feast of St. Thomas, the apostle. He is remembered primarily for two things: that he was the one who did not believe in the Resurrection, and that he brought Christianity to India. Thank God for 'Doubting Thomas'. His doubts healed the wounds of our own disbelief. They also open up for all who look with the eyes of faith a deeper understanding of the redemptive effect of the wounds of Jesus - and the role our own wounds can have in our continuing call to conversion as we join them to His.

Pope St. Gregory the Great comments that Thomas' incredulity, even his resistance to believing, did more to kindle our faith than the faith of the other apostles. For when Thomas saw the Risen Lord bearing the wounds of our mortal flesh, he uttered a profession of faith repeated countless times by Christians everywhere: "My Lord and my God!" That encounter with the Risen Lord changed Thomas forever. Not bound by the fetters of doubt and unbelief, he was no longer a *doubting* Thomas. He was instead an *evangelizing* Thomas who proclaimed the Gospel far and wide and bore witness to the Crucified and Risen Lord by his own death, his martyrdom. Thomas the doubter became the Thomas the model believer, an example for each one of us. He is a great beacon of light for all of us as we are called to cry out with him, My Lord and My God!

Blessed María Romero Meneses

On 7 July we celebrate the feast of our Blessed Maria Romero. She was known as "The Social Apostle of Costa Rica" and "The Female John Bosco". She was an apostle of charity and social reform, teacher and catechist, establishing villages with work opportunities for the

poor. She was also a mystic and apostle of the Holy Eucharist and of Mary. "With a passionate love for God and an unlimited confidence in the assistance of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Sr. Maria Romero was an exemplary religious, apostle and mother of the poor people, who were her real favorites", commented Pope Saint John Paul II on the day of her beatification. Let us make our own her saying, "Give to whoever asks you. And what can I give? I must give myself, I must give my intelligence to teach those who do not know, and to correct those in error. I must give my life. I must give my time so that all the thirsty can drink".

All the other saints of the month – St. Maria Goretti, St. Joachim and Ann, St. Alphonsa and St. Ignatius of Loyola – are also an invitation for each one of us to make holiness as our way of life. St. Maria Goretti teaches us commitment to purity, a life of faith and forgiveness; Sts Joachim and Ann remind us that the elders are the transmitters of wisdom to the younger generations; St. Alphonsa is an inspiration for all of us to accept our daily cross with great serenity and peace and only for love of God; and St. Ignatius reminds us to do everything only for the greater glory of God.

Call to greater Commitment and Creative Fidelity

Dear Sisters, the three years that prepare us for the 150th anniversary of the foundation of the Institute that rose in Mornese on 5 August 1872, are an occasion for us not only to thank God for the prodigies of holiness of the past history but also a clarion call to greater commitment to holiness in creative fidelity to the founding charism. This demands of us a continual self-formation. Our Constitutions speak to this regard: "Religious profession lived in fidelity to God in the spirit of Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello, and as a response to the expectations of the Church and of young people, requires continual self-formation" (C 100). This ongoing formation helps us to know how to respond to the demands of our mission and the challenges of the present world as the GC XXIV convocation letter very well puts it. It implies a constant dedication and effort on our part for a spiritual, intellectual and professional renewal, so that it permits us to understand and respond to the new realities of the ever-changing contemporary world, and make our educational mission more and more fruitful.

Continual self-formation, understood in this way, helps integrate creativity with fidelity, especially since our vocation requires dynamic growth and a faithful response to the Lord's calls that come to us daily in a new way. The quality of our apostolate depends on this. It refers to a faithfulness that must reproduce with courage, the creativity and the holiness of our founders in order to carry out what Don Bosco and Mother Mazzarello would do today. From this perspective, ongoing self-formation implies living in a continuous process of conversion and spiritual renewal.

The daily, renewed commitment to our vocation in creative fidelity implies also an assiduous dedication to reading and to the deepening of our charism. This requires setting aside time for reading and reflection on a daily basis. To this regard, in our Constitutions we read: "Each day we shall also dedicate ourselves to personal and community spiritual reading in order to deepen our spiritual, ecclesial, and salesian formation" (C39), and "let each Sister commit herself to setting aside a sufficient amount of time each day for extra formative reading" (R 25). Let us therefore dear Sisters, make use of all the opportunities given to us by our Institute to decisively renew our daily fidelity to Jesus and our educational mission, so as to be in the Church and in the society, a sign of love and hope for many young people. In

this way, vocational fruitfulness too will come to our communities. Let entrust each other to Mary our Mother and Teacher so that she will help us to be her true and authentic daughters in today's world.
