My dear Sisters,

Affectionate and warm greetings from Provincial House, Dum Dum!

As we are fast approaching the celebration of the Provincial Community day with the theme, 'Synodal community, generating life and joy', and the sixth Provincial Chapter, one of the most important events in the life of the province, I thought of reflecting with you a few points on:

Building a Synodal Community Today, in the footsteps of M. Mazzarello and the first community of Mornese'

"We want to live a synodal style in our communities", we read in the document in preparation for GC XXIV. What do you mean by 'synodality' or being 'a synodal community'? It simply means a way of being and acting, a "walking together", "working together" promoting the participation of all in the common educational mission. If synodality is understood in this way, we can boldly say that even in Mornese, Mother Mazzarello and the first community lived this style of life. Therefore, I would like to reflect with you how synodality was lived in Mornese in order to announce the good news of the gospel, in other words, to be a missionary community with vocational fruitfulness:

### i) The style of involvement and collaboration

The community of Mornese was based on the collaboration and involvement of all: FMA, lay collaborators, families and the girls themselves. It was characterized by 'presence' that was flexible and attentive to the needs of each, just like in a family where living together was pervaded by kindness, love and joy. Because Mother Mazzarello and the Sisters were aware that education requires a combination of interventions, complementarity, reciprocity, collaboration at various levels.

#### ii) Together with the young people

The synodal style of Mornese was that of "walking together with the young", which was much more than a simple "preferential option for the young", of "doing something for them". The young people were the protagonists of the journey of growth, and in the community all had something to give and something to receive from the young. Therefore, it was a matter of living in "communion with them", growing together in the discovery and understanding of the Gospel and in searching for the most authentic ways to live it and bear witness to it.

#### iii) In the style of the Preventive System

The community of Mornese was based on the values that characterize the Preventive System: the value of the human person created in the image and likeness of God, "taking care" of the

person who must grow in freedom, joyful and familiar acceptance; the values of attentive listening, trust, closeness, diligent and loving care, friendship, solidarity, gratuitousness, recognition of others, encouragement, adherence to God's plan, self-giving in love, in joy etc.

#### iv) Founded on the Eucharist

The synodal style of the Mornese community was above all based on the Eucharist, that is, on the logic of giving and of receiving. The daily appointment with Christ in the Eucharist was an invitation for them to become bread broken, to be a gift for others, especially for young people. The Eucharist enabled them to live a Eucharistic existence and also to become a way of walking together with the young, giving themselves in reciprocity and love.

#### v) With the style of Mary: spiritual motherhood

The style of "walking together" (synodal lifestyle) by the first community of Mornese recalls the style of Mary of Nazareth: spiritual motherhood. This motherhood was expressed in maternal solicitude, in intuition and in acting with the heart of a mother, like Mary of Nazareth at the wedding at Cana and at the foot of the Cross. This spiritual motherhood was closely connected to their capacity for interpersonal relationship, in their capacity for listening, sisterly help, patience and unconditional trust.

Let us therefore, look at Mother Mazzarello and the first community of Mornese and learn from them to live the synodal lifestyle, also in each of our communities. To do this, we also need to intensify the 'family spirit' in the community, which provides the conditions for this to happen. What are these conditions? Our Mother General proposes four conditions:

- gift each other with an attentive listening that expresses acceptance of the other as a part of myself;
- value/appreciate everyone's contribution in the community;
- involve everyone and make each one co-responsible
- give importance to dialogue in the community where the person is at the center and can freely express herself, her richness and creativity.

The logic of walking together, as we said, finds its strength in the Eucharist (cf. C 40). It was thus for Mary Domenica (remember the 'window' of the Valponasca) and also for our Sisters in Mornese who found in the celebration of the Easter mystery, the secret to make themselves a gift of love. Let us therefore focus our attention on forming Synodal Communities in our province.

I am sure that you are in full preparation for the Provincial Chapter. I believe that you have received all the instructions and guidelines and also some of the responsibilities from Sr. Elizabeth Vallyil, the Moderator of the Provincial Chapter. Give also your positive Proposals for GC XXIV as well as suggestions and proposals for the growth of the Province.

### **BLESSING OF THE HOSTEL BUILDING AT THECHO**

On 31 August Sr. Stella Potteparambil and I had the joy of being present for the Blessing and Inauguration of the New Hostel building at Thecho, Nepal. I thank God for this beautiful gift. We read in the Psalm 127 "If the Lord does not build the house in vain do we labour." It

is indeed a gift from God and we praise thank Him for His benevolence to us. Rt. Rev. Paul Simick, Apostolic Vicariate of Nepal officiated the holy Eucharist which was followed by the inauguration and blessing of the Hostel building in the presence of a good number of people, benefactors and well-wishers. It is indeed the realization of a long-cherished dream to provide more space and better facilities and to accommodate more boarders as there is great demand for boarding for children from the interior villages where there are no proper schooling facilities. The building is beautifully constructed and it is well done. I really appreciate and thank all those who have been instrumental in its completion. I want especially to place on record the hard work and the meticulous supervision carried out by Sr. Aquila Phawa, together with her community members who collaborated with her whole heartedly for the realization of this project. Together, let us thank the Lord and praise Him for his goodness.

There was a session on "A purview of the way to answer the questions posed in the preparatory document of GC XXIV".
